# World tour

Cyclists Jules Cooper and Jess Macaulay will have covered four continents, 27 countries and more than 33,000 kilometres when they arrive in Melbourne on July 3.

Having left Argentina in December 2008 taking the 'long way home' to Melbourne, the two spent a night in Lakes Entrance last week.

Leaving from the southern most point of Argentina, they made their way to Peru, flew to London, they then cycled to Singapore via Moscow and Beijing.

From Singapore they flew to Darwin in March before hopping back on their bicycles and heading south via Tennant Creek, Cairns and the east coast for 8000 kilometres.

Jules described the journey as an incredible cultural experience.

In Australia they have been raising money for the Ardoch Youth Foundation, which operates in schools in capital cities across Australia.

The two aim to explain to the children they meet that tasks which may seem impossible can be achieved by breaking them down into smaller steps, and keep a blog so the children can track their progress.

As their journey draws to a close, they report mixed emotions.

"Going back to reality will be interesting as well," Jules joked, adding that the trip seems to have been going quicker since Sydney."

## Sentenced

Bairnsdale truck driver, Brett Janson, was last week handed a three-year suspended jail term for the deaths of six-year-old Jeton Kulafovski, and nine-year-old Lyton Mustafiovski.

The the two boys were killed as a result of Mr Janson running a red light south-east of Melbourne in March 2008.

In sentencing, Judge Felicity Hampel said she had taken into account Janson's remorse for the victims, their families and his own family.

The court was told that Janson drove into the intersection 9-10 seconds after the lights turned red, his prime mover hitting the car driven by Lyton's mother. He was not speeding, drunk, fatigued or drug-affected.

Janson pleaded guilty to two counts of dangerous driving causing death and three counts of dangerous driving causing injury.

He was disqualified from driving for two years and alongside the suspended jail sentence must undertake 250 hours of community work.
